

BRING'EM BACK



“Bring’Em Back” is a striking new singing competition that focuses on contestants’ sheer vocal talent.

With a never-before-seen 30 piece orchestra, and a grand theater with luxurious curtains, “Bring ‘Em Back” is the next in-demand talent show. Each contestant takes to the stage alone and has 90 seconds to sing a song before the curtains close dramatically on them. Now, the audience have just 20 seconds to cast their vote. If the majority of the audience like the singer, the curtains open and the contestant continues their song. If they are not chosen, the curtains reveal an empty stage. Two hard-hitting judges from the industry then weigh in with their comments and votes. The four best performances per episode are selected. The singer with the most votes moves into the semi-final, while the one with the least is eliminated.

Those in second and third place have another chance to prove themselves with a 30 second a cappella performance. Each round becomes harder and harder as the contestants have to face tough criticism and earn over 80% approval from the audience. Only the most brilliant will survive.

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The structure of the program will be the following way:

In the studio with audience (approx. 300): Host comes on stage and opens the show, introduces jury members and explains the program.

Then host announces first song. (We have no clue about the contestant's background; even his/her name.)

ROUND ONE - AUDITIONS: (Week#1 – 10) The orchestra starts playing the song, while the curtains are still closed.

The curtains sweep open, and the audience waits to see who will step on to the stage, the singer begins the song. The song is coming to an exciting end, at the peak of their song, the 90-second mark, the curtains close. Now it's the audience's turn. In Bring'em Back, the audience is the first stop in the grueling auditions for the contestants to continue on the road to stardom. They have 20 seconds to decide and the orchestra plays on in a reminder of the singer. The votes are calculated instantly. If 80% of the audience voted YES, the audience welcomes the contestant back with cheers and contestant completes the song.



If not, we lose the contestant and we will not have the chance to know who that person was, not even his/her name, we will lose them for good. Leaving viewers at home and the audience in the studio, sorry to see them go, wondering who the singer was.

At the end of each episode, contestants who are qualified over 80 percent votes from the audiences come to the stage. Number#1 contestant with the highest of votes directly moves on to semi-finals. Second and third ranking contestants have one more chance to move forward in the competition. Each singer has 30 seconds to perform a capella and this time the judges select the one to move on. The singers with the lowest votes (after first 3) leave the competition. So, in each episode, we have 2 semi-finalists.

Once during the show, the judges can use a "save" to bring one of the eliminated singers back. That singer gets a do-over - this time, audience would agree with the judges or that contestant is sent packing for good.



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SEMI FINALS: (Week# 11-14)

On Week 11, semi-finals begin with 20 contestants, bringing 3 more weeks of intense competition.

In the semi-finals of Bring'em Back the best performances of the season is chosen. The winners of the regular shows (in week#1 – 10) automatically go to the semi-finals. But in the semi-final, things get much harder. This time, we are more familiar with the contestants since we have witnessed their performances at the previous weeks.

The contestants are brought back to sing 2 new songs. If they receive an 80 percent vote from the audience with their first song, they can perform again. If not, they are out.

At the end of each semi-final episode, contestants who performed 2 songs come to the stage. Number#1 contestant with the highest of votes directly moves on to Grand Final. Second and third ranking contestants have one more chance to move forward in the competition. Each singer has 30 seconds to perform a capella and judges select the one to move on.

The singers with the lowest votes (after first 3) leave the competition. So, in each semi-final episodes, we have 2 finalists. (in total 6 finalists)

GRAND FINAL (Week# 15)

In the final week, the competition follows the same format with 6 contestants, but this time the losing candidates (14 contestants) from semi-finals take a seat with the celebrity judges to join the jury and make the final decision.



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
